

## School Website Curriculum Information

### You should publish:

- The school curriculum content for each subject and year group, including Religious Education (even if it is taught as part of another subject or subjects, or is called something else)
- The names of any phonics or reading schemes you are using in Key Stage 1
- A list of the courses available to pupils at Key Stage 4, including GCSEs
- How parents or other members of the public can find out more about the curriculum your school is following

### Pupils and parents may want to know:

- What skills and knowledge pupils will learn in each subject and at each stage
- The design, structure and sequence of learning e.g. how learning builds progressively from one year group to another
- How the curriculum is taught and assessed?

### You might want to use these questions to identify and articulate your intent

- Why is it shaped the way it is? What values have guided your decisions about the curriculum you have in place?
- How does your curriculum reflect your school's context?
- What are the objectives for your curriculum? What do you want pupils to be able to know and do by the time they leave you?
- How does your curriculum plan set out the sequence and structure of how it is going to be implemented?
- How does your curriculum reflect national policy (for example, British values and PSHE)?
- How does the curriculum support all pupil groups? How clear are your objectives? Does everybody know them?
