We are a 3-form entry Infant school with a welcoming staff and Governing Body team. It has ambition at its core for all the children and a strong approach to developing the whole child. We include opportunities for Forest School adventures and learning through experiences. The school has a Ready, Respectful and Safe culture which supports high quality learning opportunities, inclusion, interactions and leads to success for all- pupils and staff!

- is a team player, able to work closely with teachers and other adults within our school community to ensure the best outcomes for our pupils

Experience of working in an infant or primary setting is preferred but we will support you with full training. Professional development and career opportunities will be available for the right candidate within the school and the wider Hamwic Education Trust.

This role involves:

- supporting the teacher by working with individuals or groups of children to support their learning and development
- demonstrating a good understanding of safeguarding practices and confidentiality
- establishing supportive, caring and secure relationships with the child/ children, promoting respect, self-esteem and a positive, inclusive whole school ethos
- contributing to evaluation, review and planning discussions with the teacher, SENCo and other members of the support team
- offering a fair and consistent approach to managing behaviour and individual needs in line with school policies and procedures
- helping, supporting and motivating the children, clarifying instructions, encouraging independent learning and behaviour and enabling learning targets and outcomes to be achieved
- delivering interventions under the direction of the class teacher
- liaising with outside agencies as appropriate with the support of the SENCo

Glenfield uses a 'team around the child' approach to ensure consistent, high quality and purposeful support to enable all children to achieve their best, recognising different starting points and learning journeys.
